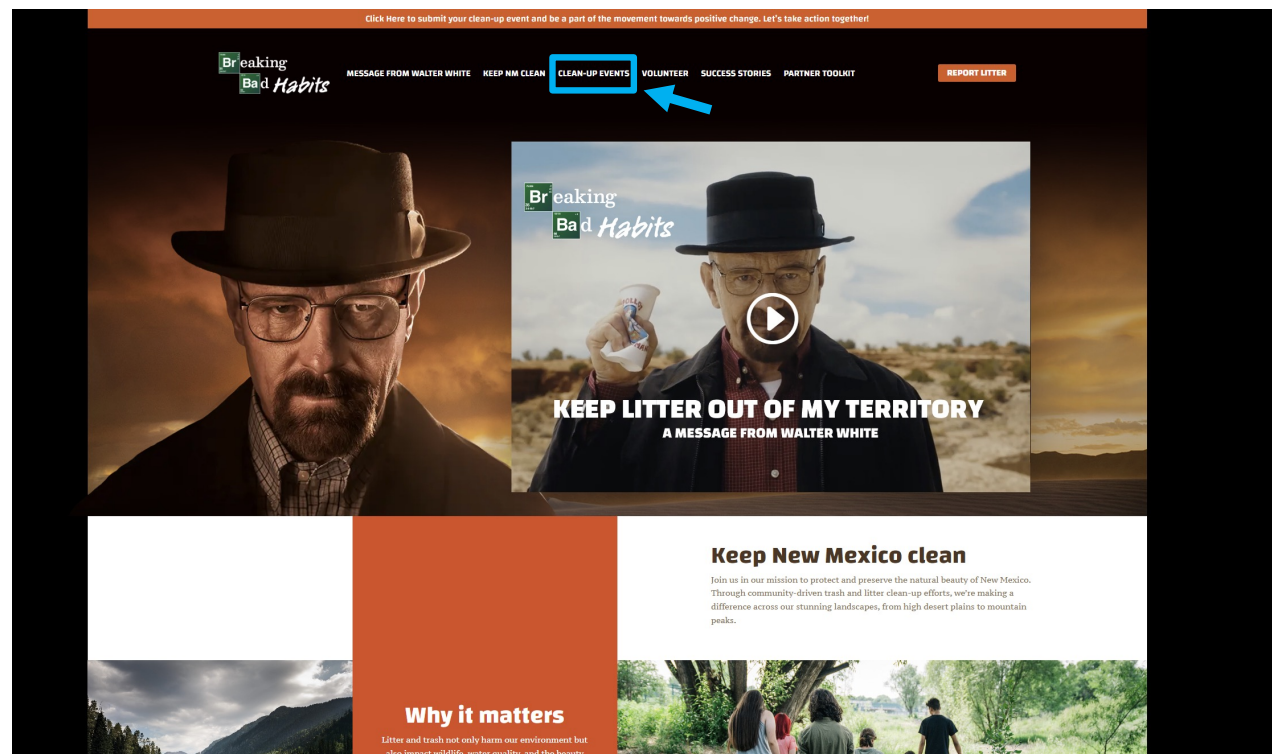

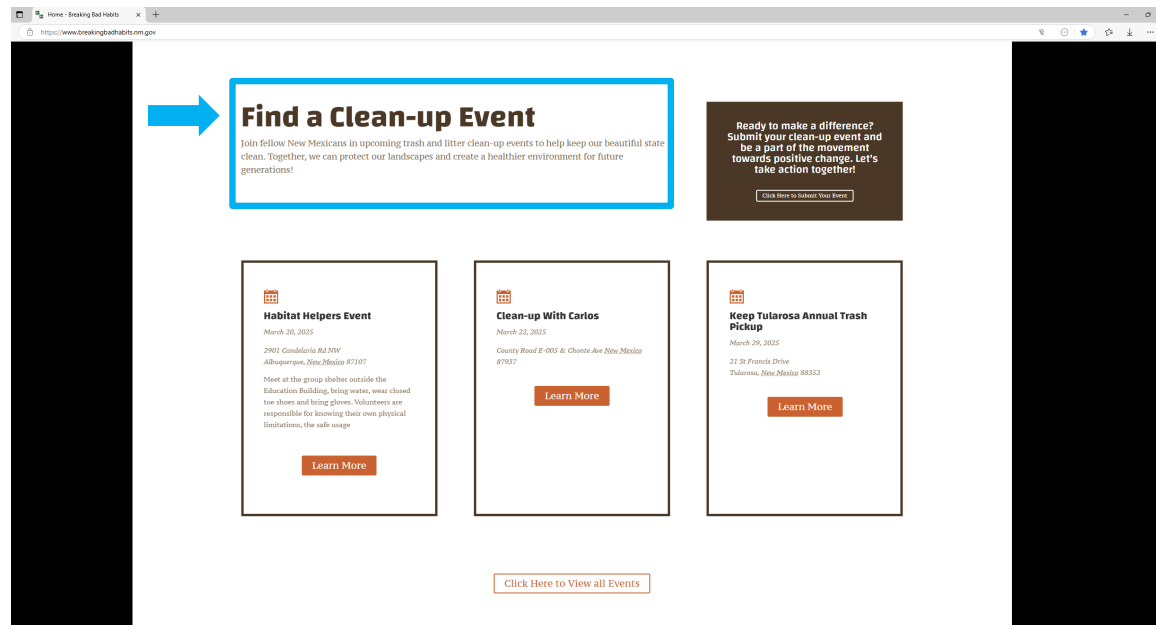
Three Ways to Submit an Event



Option 1: Click on 'CLEAN-UP EVENTS'

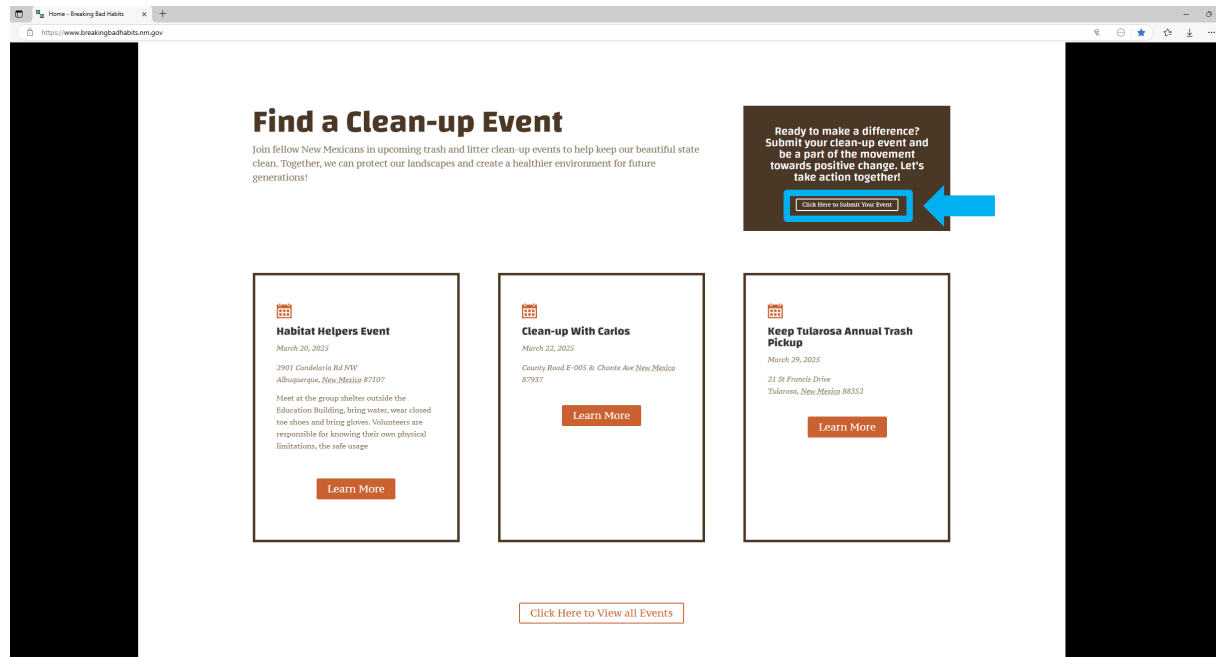

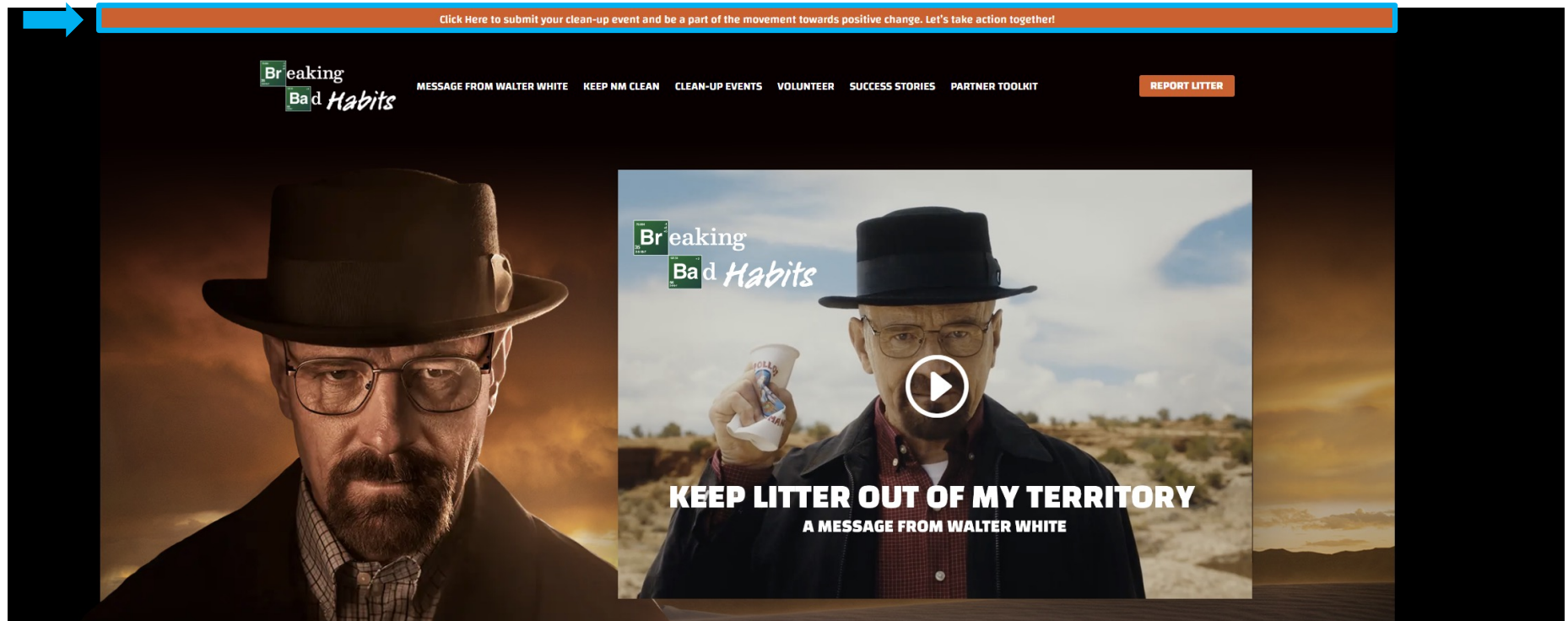



